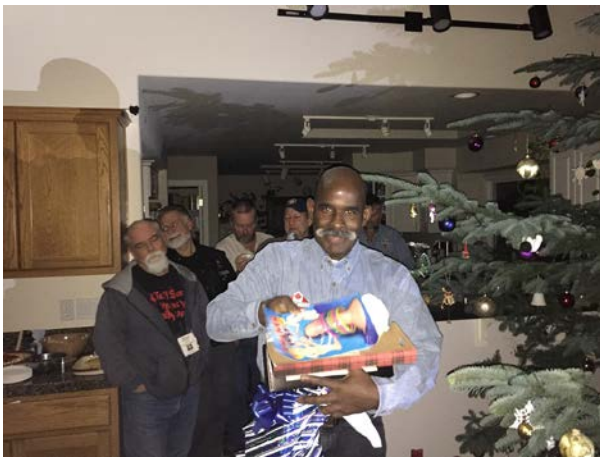
Local Ride Activities

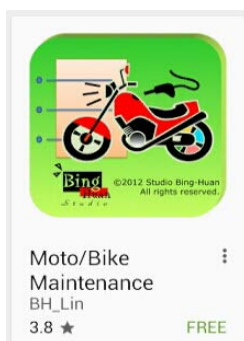

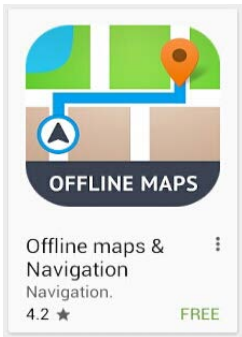

Off Line Maps

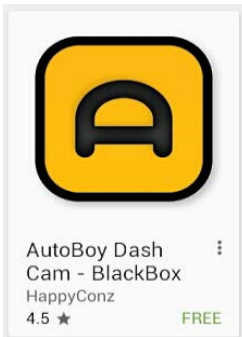

Dash Cam

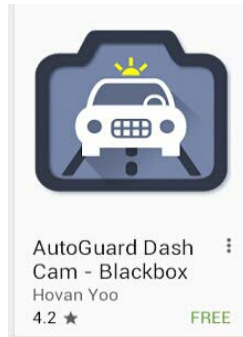


There are many programs that turn your smartphone into a dash cam. I use an old phone I had in the drawer, it only needs GPS capability to use the cool features.

This is very reliable for a dash cam.

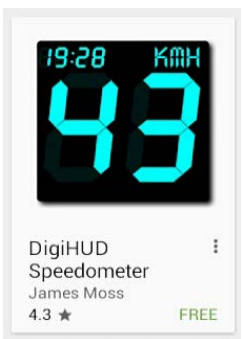


Smart Dash Cam
